



Garden River Resource Centre 3D Printing Policy

Guidelines

Purpose

The purpose of the Garden River Resource Centre 3D Printing policy is to promote the Garden River Resource Centre's ability to enhance the community's innovative and creativeness with an opportunity to print their 3D creations.

The 3D Printer was made available by funding provided by the Government of Ontario.

The 3D printer is available for use by the Garden River Public Library's patrons and their families. Printing is done on a first-come, first serve basis. The Library reserves the right to limit printing. The printer is available for educational purpose to make three dimensional objects in plastic using a design that is uploaded from a digital computer file.

The 3D printer maybe used for lawful purposes only. Patrons will not be permitted to use the printer to create objects that are:

- Prohibited by local, provincial or federal law.
- In violation of another's intellectual proper rights; for example, materials that is subject to copyright, patent or trademark protection.
- Unsafe, harmful, dangerous or that may pose an immediate threat to the well being of others.
- Obscene or otherwise inappropriate items for the library environment.
- That are illegal or harmful to minors
- That maybe construed as having intent to harm

The design must be applicable for printing with PLA filament and must be versatile to the selection available at the Library at the time of printing. The finished product can only be smaller than 4" long X 5" wide X 5" tall.

The design should be downloaded to a USB drive as a .stl file.

Digital designs are also available from various file-sharing databases such at Thingiverse.com

The library is not responsible for failed 3D prints, although we will do our best to assist in completing successful 3D prints.

The printer will only print an object in a single colour.

Library staff reserve the right to resize projects to fit the dimensions available to print.

By submitting content or objects, the patron agrees to assume all responsibility for, and shall hold the library harmless in, all matters related to patented, trademarked or copyrighted materials.

The library is not responsible for the functionality or quality of content produced on the 3D printer.

Refunds are not permitted.

Printer is to be operated by library staff only.

Printed items are presented 'as is' to the user. Library staff will not remove any scaffolding, sidewalks, or support pieces for the user.

The library will review all files submitted for printing and reserves the right to refuse an 3D print request.

Please note that procedures governing the use of the library's 3D printers are subject to change.
