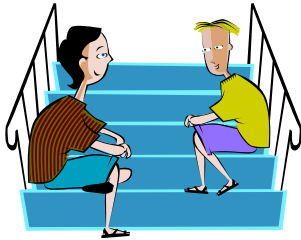

All students will be faced with more responsi-

*walk to and from designated bus stops which
can be up to 1.5 kms from your

teams, academic field trip etc... Com-
